To me, nothing makes the High Holiday services feel as special or

Membership Director's Report Keith Elliott

Remember those T-shirts that said things like "My friend went to San Francisco, and all I got was the lousy T-shirt"? I have a new one.

"My Friend went to an ordination, and all I got was this lousy lay service".

Monday night, many of us had the honor to see Rabbi Lisa's ordination at Steven S. Wise temple. It was a fabulous experience; a fabulous service, a fabulous facility, and what must have been one of their most exciting moments of their lives for the six people being ordained as rabbis and cantors.

The following Friday, I had the task of leading a lay

service without the support of a Rabbi-or even of a cantor. (Cantor Karen has been unavailable due to an injury-refuah sh'lemah, Karen!) Sorry about the lousy T-Shirt...

One of the most striking things I noticed was that to create half a dozen clergy people took the efforts of many times that number of educators, mentors, sponsors, and supporters. In addition, every candidate was being

supported by a large group from their own community (TNA was represented by over 30 members!). The staff outnumbered the students several to one. This was no minor title being bestowed on a few hobbyists, I can assure you. Steven S. Wise Temple was nearly full to the rafters with supporters of those six amazing people receiving their degrees and ordination that night.

The first part of the ceremony involved the giving of the Master's Degrees they had all earned, but the real moment, the one that gave me chills, was when the Beit Din accepted each candidate as a leader-a leader of our people. In our reform world, we don't have much actual contact with a Beit Din. Indeed, for many of us, the very name conjures up distasteful (and largely inaccurate) images of ultra-conservative groups. However, the Beit din still exists in our world, to the surprise of many.

Generally in America, we only think about such courts in terms of conversions and divorce, but in reality, a large part-possibly the main part-of what a Rabbi does for his or her congregation is to serve as their authority on law.

So back to my story-it was striking to see the *Beit din* from Lisa's seminary, the Academy for Jewish Religion, in action. There were many members-perhaps ten, including rabbis who had sponsored those being ordained that night. (Each candidate had a sponsor, who served a role like the advisor does for a graduate college student. They have helped shepherd each candidate through their five years of instruction and learning.) The rabbi in a local congregation like ours is, then, the leader of our *Beit Din*. Their role is not only to lead us in service, which is clearly something we can do on our own in a pinch (and did for some time in our early history.)

It was the first time I ever witnessed students

transforming into Rabbis, and it was moving. This was not simply the earning of a degree; it was the transformation of a life. The sheer scale and import of the event was almost overwhelming, especially when I realized that the sole purpose for it all was to ensure that even the smallest congregations, like ours, could have a rabbisomeone to lead us from the pulpit AND lead us in nearly any other part of our lives. For every candidate, the journey from lay

person to Rabbi was profound-it really did seem that that moment was one of the defining moments of their entire lives. And most remarkably, for the second time, our tiny little congregation has had the honor of helping someone make that transition, and that is something we ought to be extremely proud of. Indeed, when I think of the people we have who served us and help guide our spiritual lives at Temple Ner Ami, I am nearly embarrassed by our wealth.

It is curious that in the last month of our Temple's year, we should have a couple of lay services, in the face of that wealth. But that is not only the irony, but a lesson itself-even with the blessing of a clergy to lead us, it is still we who must lead ourselves at all times. In the final consideration, we don't congregate as followers of a leader, but as members of a community. Without a community, what could a Rabbi do? Over the last year, I have tried to talk about the importance of developing the sense that each and every one of us "owns" this congregation, and is responsible for it.

How much more plain it became to me that night, when I realized that we need to live up to the life-changing commitment our Rabbis have made to us.

So in spite of all of us going to Lisa's ordination, all everyone got that next Friday was a lousy lay service-not that it's that bad (I can dare to hope!). While we truly need our clergy to lead us, not only at services, but at all times in our life, we can't ask them to lead us unless we are willing to do our own part, and make sure that our community exists as a vibrant whole. It's up to us to live up to the gifts we receive. Let's all try and remember that our Temple isn't there for us to go to at need, to pick and choose benefits like we're walking down the aisle at Walmart, but that it requires our hearts to be devoted completely to it for it to survive at all.

On June 29th, Rabbi Mike will be leading his last Shabbat Service as Temple Ner Ami's head Rabbi, and there will be a Farewell Dinner beforehand that I not only want to ask all of you to attend, but I'd ask that you contact any and all members of our community and invite them as well (call the temple office for details). The following week will be Rabbi Lisa's first Shabbat Service as our head Rabbi, and we need to be there in strength as well. We have been doubly blessed by being part of the process whereby Mike and Lisa both reached one of their lives' highest honors, and we should be there both nights to thank them for allowing us to have been a part of it.

You're purchases are tracked and available to you online, allowing you to see how much money you're earning for our Torah school.

To get started go to www.escrip.com, a secure site, and follow the instructions to become a supporter of Temple Ner Ami Torah School. Register your grocery cards for Von's, Safeway, and Pavillions and existing credit and debit cards. It's easy. Ask your friends and extended family members to sign on, too.

If you are already registered, log on to make sure your account is updated. Von's cards need to be re-registered annually. Make sure your e-mail address and cards are current.

Don't have computer access? Call me at 984-5777 and I'll sign you up.

Ralph's rewards is a similar program. Every time you swipe your card, Ralph's will make a donation to Temple Ner Ami. Go to www.ralphs.com and click on "Ralphs rewards," in the upper right corner, then click on "create an account," then on "Get started. Sign up today." After you create an account, link your account with the temple by editing your "community contribution" page. When you search for Temple Ner Ami, it comes up Jewish Families of Camarillo/

Temple Ner Ami. If you don't have a Ralph's card you can get one at customer service. If you enter your phone number instead of swiping your card when you shop, just enter your phone number instead of your Ralph's card where it gives you the option of providing an "alternate ID."

It only takes a few minutes to enroll in these programs. It's an easy way to earn money for our Torah School and temple. **Please take a moment to sign up.** Members who

do not sign-up for these programs, will automatically be signed up for the dunking tank at the next Purim Carnival.
