## Rabbi's 'Last Supper' and Shabbat at TNA

Friday June 29, 2012 marked the end of Rabbi Michael Lotker's career as our Rabbi. A dinner hosted by TNA Sisterhood was held to honor Rabbi Lotker. It was followed by a uniquely special Shabbat service. If you were one of the more than one hundred people who were fortunate to be there this is what you were a part of...

When you arrived, you were greeted outside by our dear temple member Lee Edwards and our very hard working Temple Administrator, Mark Malloy, who collected your ticket and presented you with a specially designed name tag and place tag created for this event by Mark. Champagne was poured and hor d'oerves were served at another outside table by Howard Brody, Shlomo Kreitzer and former Board President Lew Stone.

When you wanted to, you could go to one of the many indoor tables that were set up both in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall to accommodate the large group of Rabbi well wishers. Rabbi Lotker greeted all of the congregants and guests, then welcomed everyone with his own style of humor... showing us some special foods for his "Last Supper." After the cocktail hour and visiting, the tables were invited to go to the lovely buffet dinner set up in the foyer by DJ's Catering. Rabbi Mike with his wife, Sonia, and Rabbi Lisa with her husband, Ken, led the buffet line which went very smoothly with apron-clad Naomi Brill in charge. The lovely meal of Mediterranean Chicken, roasted vegetables, rice pilaf, tossed salad and freshly made rolls was enjoyed by all.

Shlomo Kreitzer, Steve Moore and Howard Brody helped clear the tables and yes, services were then held sitting at the large round tables and the pews in the sanctuary.


The service was highlighted by Rabbi Lotker's sermon on "What I Have Learned By Being Your Rabbi." It was well planned and presented with a genuine sincerity as Rabbi Mike spoke of the highlights and experiences during his 12 years of service to Temple Ner Ami. Among these thoughts he mentioned some of his beliefs including "the only people that I know who are perfectly happy - those with no serious problems - are people I don't know very well. Religion is a crutch and a crutch is a wonderful thing to have." He said, "Life is unfair and we should be thankful for this fact since we have so much more than our fair share." Rabbi Lotker stated that he knows how blessed he is and he is grateful for it.

Along with the help of some of our talented and well spoken guests, Sisterhood planned a surprise program for Rabbi Lotker. Shlomo Kreitzer served as our MC and introduced Julia Newman and Saul Lessler, our temple musical pillars, who started the program with a song to the tune of "Oklahoma," by changing the lyrics to describe Rabbi Lotker's life. It was so creative and kept everyone laughing. After rousing applause, Julia stayed at the microphone to thank the Rabbi for the support that he gave her to develop the excellent Torah School Program that she has directed for many years.

Representing the Board of Directors of the Temple, two of the tresidents, Sarene Wallace and Nadine Frankel, thanked Rabbi and presented him with two gifts. One gift was a leaf to add to the Tree of Life in the foyer honoring his years of service to the Temple. Rabbi Lisa Bock was next to thank Rabbi Lotker with a poem and some sweet words describing their friendship and his mentoring her at our Temple.

Julia and Saul appeared once again with a musical interlude about the Rabbi by singing the "Jet Song" from Westside Story, which they magically transformed. This was followed by the Sisterhood Board of Directors presenting Rabbi Lotker with their gift of appreciation as
well as one for Sonia, to thank her for her tireless efforts. Julia Newman, our outstanding Torah School Director, was invited to come up and was presented with a check for $\$ 3600$. This gift from Sisterhood was for the programs that she oversees for the Torah School and Teens.

The Sisterhood Board: Sonia Lotker, Naomi Brill, Elvira Cabelli, Bobbe Jacobs, Bev Kerwien, Shari Brody, Arla Crane and Ann Burke were applauded for their work in putting the dinner party together. Snapping pictures throughout the evening was Allyson Williams, who we thank for serving as our official temple photographer!

Shlomo Kreitzer spoke eloquently about his feelings on Rabbi Lotker's departure. Shari Brody followed with her thoughts on what Rabbi Lotker and the Temple has meant to her and to her family.

Closing the program were our

stars Julia and Saul with their final song from Mary Poppins, "Super-cali-fragil-istic" weaving Rabbi Mike into it, as only they could do.

Following the service, it was on to the Oneg. Everyone enjoyed the beautiful and delicious cake especially prepared and decorated for Rabbi Lotker by Bev Kerwien. She had even put Hebrew letters on the cake.

We were very fortunate that the Thousand Oaks company called Nothing Bundt Cakes supplied 150 kosher samples of their 10 flavors of bundtinis for us to try. All of their cakes in every size are kosher and they graciously donated these cakes to our event.

This was a stellar evening in many ways. Once again our congregation came together to put on a lovely dinner and program to honor Rabbi Lotker, who has meant so much to so many people, for so many years.

## Hands

Back in the fifteenth century, in a tiny village near Nuremburg, lived a family with eighteen children. Eighteen! In order merely to keep food on the table for this mob, the father and head of the household, a goldsmith by profession, worked almost eighteen hours a day at his trade and any other paying chore he could find in the neighborhood.
Despite their seemingly hopeless condition, two of Albrecht Durer the Elder's children had a dream. They both wanted to pursue their talent for art, but they knew full well that their father would never financially be able to send either of them to Nuremburg to study at the Academy.
After many long discussions at night in their crowded bed, the two boys finally worked out a pact. They would toss a coin. The loser would go down into the nearby mines and, with his earnings, support his brother while he attended the academy. Then, when that brother who won the toss completed his studies, in four years, he would support the other brother at the academy, either with sales of his artwork or, if necessary, also by laboring in the mines.
They tossed a coin one Sunday morning. Albrecht Durer won the toss and went off to Nuremburg.
Albert went down into the dangerous mines and, for the next four years, financed his brother, whose work at the academy was almost an immediate sensation. Albrecht's etchings, his woodcuts, and his oils were far better than those of most of his professors, and by the time he graduated, he was beginning to earn considerable fees for his commissioned works.
When the young artist returned to his village, the Durer family held a festive dinner on their lawn to celebrate Albrecht's triumphant homecoming. After a long and memorable meal, punctuated with music and laughter,

Albrecht rose from his honored position at the head of the table to drink a toast to his beloved brother for the years of sacrifice that had enabled Albrecht to fulfill his ambition. His closing words were, "And now, Albert, blessed brother of mine, now it is your turn. Now you can go to Nuremburg to pursue your dream, and I will take care of you."
All heads turned in eager expectation to the far end of the table where Albert sat, tears streaming down his pale face, shaking his lowered head from side to side while he sobbed and repeated, over and over, "No... no...no."
Finally, Albert rose and wiped the tears from his cheeks. He glanced down the long table at the faces he loved, and then, holding his hands close to his right cheek, he said softly, "No, brother, I cannot go to Nuremberg. It is too late for me. Look...look what four years in the mines have done to my hands! The bones in every finger have been smashed at least once, and lately I have been suffering from arthritis so badly in my right hand that I cannot even hold a glass to return your toast, much less make delicate lines on parchment or canvas with a pen or a brush. No, brother...for me it is too late."
More than 450 years have passed. By now, Albrecht Durer's hundreds of masterful portraits, pen and silver-point sketches, watercolors, charcoals, woodcuts, and copper engravings hang in every great museum in the world, but the odds are great that you, like most people, are familiar with only one of Albrecht Durer's works. More than merely being familiar with it, you may have a reproduction hanging in your home or office.

One day, to pay homage to Albert for all that he had sacrificed, Albrecht Durer painstakingly drew his brother's abused hands with palms
together and thin fingers stretched skyward. He called his powerful drawing simply Hands, but the entire world almost immediately opened their hearts to his great masterpiece and renamed his tribute of love The Praying Hands.

The next time you see a copy of that touching creation, take a second look. Let it be your reminder, if you still need one, that no one-no one-ever makes it alone!

The author of this story is unknown, but was selected as retold in a book titled Rosh Hashanah Readings by Dov Peretz Elkins.

As I read this story, I was reminded that we are here by the blessing of those who not only came before us, but by those who are around us.

There are no monasteries or hermits in Judaism.
Think of Jewish events in your life - a lifecycle event such as a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, a babynaming, a wedding. Think of Shabbat, Passover, Chanukah, High Holy Days. We do none of these alone.

Being Jewish is not a solitary activity. Just as Albrecht could not have become an artist without his brother, we cannot be Jewish alone. We need one another. We can get information from the internet, but not a community that we become a part of, that feeds the soul, and enlivens the spirit. Therefore, being Jewish, doing Jewish, requires that we be Jewish together, that we be a community. Just as a minyan requires the presence of ten Jews, the Jewish community needs your heart and your hands.

As we move forward into 5773 at Temple Ner Ami, may we do so with gratitude for community, blessing and shalom, peace.

On July 8th, some temple members spent four hours working on a Habitat for Humanity home build in partnership with Temple Adat Elohim. Habitat uses donated property from the city to build houses for deserving families. This one was in Oxnard off of Vineyard. There is a rigorous selection process and the owner is not given the house. The owner is expected to pay a mortgage and must put 500 sweat equity hours into building the house. Habitat relies on volunteers for the labor. They do this work Monday through Saturday. When a temple like ours volunteers,

they work on Sunday so as to honor that we do not work on Shabbat. Doing this project helps TNA fulfill two of our four values.
