Chanukah is "early" this year...Purim is "really early" this year...What's Going On with the Calendar?



Of course we have all noticed that the High Holy Days, Chanukah, and Passover seem to move around in relation to the beginning of the school year, in relation to winter

break and in relation to Christmas and New Year's Day, and we tend to view whether Passover, in relation to Easter and spring break, is "early" or "late", too.

It's true - our dates move around, but why? What's going on here?

Well, the Jewish calendar is based on the lunar calendar, so the 15th of every Hebrew month has a full moon. And then the calendar is also synced with the solar calendar, as we also incorporate an awareness of planting season, harvest season,



the darkness of winter, and the beginning of new growth towards the end of winter - we keep our calendar true to the seasons, and that means we adjust our calendar to be consistent with the solar calendar.

Therefore, we have a "lunisolar" calendar, or fixed lunar year, based on twelve lunar months of twenty-nine or thirty days. We add one month to our calendar (Adar II – a second month of Adar), and we do this seven times every nineteen years (once every two to three years), so that we can synchronize the twelve lunar cycles with the slightly longer solar year. The solar year is longer than twelve lunar months by about 11 days.

Each Jewish lunar month starts with the new moon. Originally, the new lunar crescent had to be observed and certified by witnesses, but now in modern times, the moment of the new moon is approximated arithmetically.

We have a weekly cycle of seven days, consistent with the seven-day period of creation in the Book of Genesis. The names for the days of the week in the Hebrew calendar, like those in the Creation story, are simply the day number within the week: "first day/Yom Rishon," "second day/Yom Sheni," and so forth, with Shabbat being the seventh day. The Jewish day always begins at sunset, so the Jewish day is from sunset to the next sunset – our "day" begins in the evening!

The twelve Hebrew months and the number of days in them are: Nisan (30 days), Iyar (29 days), Sivan (30 days), Tammuz (29 days), Av (30 days), Elul (29 days), Tishrei (30 days), Marcheshvan/Heshvan (29 or 30 days), Kislev (29 or 30 days), Tevet (29 days), Shevat (30 days), and Adar (29 days). In the leap years (such as 5771) an additional month, Adar II (30 days), is added after Shevat, and the regular Adar is referred to as "Adar I".

The first month of the festival year is Nisan. 15 Nisan is the start of the festival of Passover, corresponding to the full moon of Nisan. Passover is a spring festival associated with the barley harvest, so the leap-month Adar II is inserted periodically to keep Passover in the

northern hemisphere's spring season. Since the adoption of a fixed calendar. these insertions in the Hebrew calendar have been at fixed points in a 19-year cycle.

One particular way that the difference between the Gregorian and Hebrew calendar impacts our lives is





with Yahrtzeit dates. If someone passes on a particular date, we traditionally remember that person's passing on the Hebrew date each year. The anniversary of a person's passing is their Yahrtzeit, a Yiddish word that literally means "time (of) year." So with the way dates move around – that is, when we compare the Gregorian date with the Hebrew date - that means that the date of this remembrance will move around a bit each year. At Temple Ner Ami, we recognize that some prefer to remember a loved one by following the Gregorian calendar, and we can do that if you let us know. We also record for you the Hebrew date, and our software system we use requires us to know not only the day, but the year as well. We have some dates that have defaulted in our system to 1901 or 1902, so if you receive a letter letting you know that you have a Yahrtzeit coming up and it has this type of date on it, we welcome from you a call, note, card, or email kindly letting us know - as we are in the slow but worthwhile process of updating this information.

As we move forward further into the year 5773, may we be blessed with love and kindness, friends, family, and all that we need.

GOT KIDS?? DOING JEWISH??


Here's 4 ways you and your young child can become involved.....


Dead Sea Scrolls Demystified



This class is free to all Temple Ner Ami members. A donation of \$10 per class is requested for those who are non-members.




