An old man in ancient Israel....

An old man in ancient Israel was planting a fig tree, when a Roman general happened to pass by. The general says to the man, "Don't you realize it

will take twenty years before that tree will grow enough to give fruit, and you will be long dead by then?" The old man responded, "When I was a small child, I could eat fruit because those who came before me had planted trees. Am I not obliged to do the same for the next generation?"

Imagine driving down Lewis road and no longer finding the Temple. Imagine calling and no one answers. Imagine the sanctuary, empty and silent on Shabbat. No prayers, no voices, no children, no kaddish.

Now imagine instead: a fover filled with people handing out prayer books, and welcoming and greeting one another, "Gut Shabbos!" "Shabbat Shalom!" "It's so nice to see you!" ...Imagine a parking lot filled and a sanctuary bustling with people. Prayer, song, Torah study, Sisterhood events, Teen Shabbat services, children's services, Tot Shabbat, Passover seders, classes, teachers, and students of all ages, from 9 to 90 and more, book groups, celebrations, baby namings, weddings...now imagine that not only for today, but also next year, five years from now, ten, fifty years, a hundred. Imagine Torah school, children chanting from our Torah scrolls as they become young Jewish adults. Imagine growing older here, with your community around you.

Which vision do you want?

Of course, the second image: to continue telling our stories, to pray and study to-


"If there is no flour, there is no Torah; if there is no Torah, there is no flour (Pirkei Avot 3:21)."



The word Torah is defined in the English dictionary as: The body of Jewish religious literature and

the core of the Jewish religion." Temple Ner Ami is very fortunate to own two Torahs. Each is more than 100 years old and has had a long history before reaching our Temple. It is not surprising, but was new to me, that some letters and words in the Torahs began to fade, smudge, crack and start to disappear. Fortunately, Rabbi Lisa was aware of this change and did some investigation. She was able to find a Rabbi who specializes in Torah restoration. She learned that the larger of the two Torah's was too expensive to repair. The second Torah could be restored so that the worst areas could be made readable once again. This, of course, needs to be done by hand and is very time consuming and expensive. With many Bar and Bat Mitzvahs planned at Temple in the next 8 months, this was an important need. Who knew that even Torah's need repair and maintenance?

The Board of the Sisterhood is very pleased to announce that Sisterhood paid for the work as well as the atzei chayin which means the "tree of life" (replacement of the dowels on which the Torah moves) as our gift to the Temple and its members. Sisterhood has in the past years supported the Torah School and other areas of need around the Temple. Just a few months ago, Sisterhood donated \$2000 to the Torah School and \$1500 to the Board of Directors for the Temple expenses. It was our pleasure to pay for the repair of our Torah, which is at the core of our history and religion.

Every loss we experience takes a little bit out of us. How do you replenish yourself after a loss? What has helped you heal? Do you talk to friends, family, your spiritual leader for guidance?

We each experience loss in our own personal way. After a loss we might want to be alone for awhile. At a certain point (you decide when) it is important to come back to your support network for help.



We will be starting a group meeting every other week on Wednesday afternoons entitled "Every Day is a New Beginning" to address positive ways to heal from loss. When you are ready, distractions such as laughter, exercise,

volunteering and attending services may help reduce the pain of loss.

In this support group we will be sharing our experience of loss and how to live happily again. Through laughter, tears, storytelling and meditation we will help each other break out of the cycle of loss.

Through classes, counselling and life's lessons, I have learned that many of the beliefs I grew up with were incorrect. I needed to modify my thinking.

I was taught to be strong and do things myself. My new belief system is that strength is shown when we can ask for help. Many of us find it easier to offer help than to receive it. This is a habit worth changing. We should be able to give and receive.

I also grew up keeping secrets. One such secret I kept from the neighbors was that I was Iewish. My parents feared anti-semitism. They wanted us to blend into American society. I have learned that "secrets keep you sick". Perhaps I have gone to the other

extreme and am too open, but I am proud of who I am and what I have accomplished. Living in a world where the internet makes it easy for anyone to know everything about each of us, it truly is useless to think that we have any secrets.

When we are grieving, we feel that no one understands our loss. We may try to be strong for others and not take care of ourselves. So, I return to: let's be strong and ask for help and don't let secrets keep you stuck.

The following is an exercise that may help: PROBLEM SOLVING STEPS:

- 1. Identify the problem.
- 2. List ideas to solve the problem.
- 3. Select one method to try.
- 4. Assess the results.
- 5. Substitute another idea if the first didn't work.
- 6. Utilize other resources (ask friends, family, or professionals for ideas if your solutions didn't work).
- 7. Accept that the problem may not be solvable now.


Eager Readers Book Club


