May 4 – Sunday- Genocide Walk with Temple Etz Chaim. As soon as we get the information we will get it out to everyone in the congregation.


May 30 – Friday night, ShaBBQ Sisterhood and the Temple Board together

This article is a different one: I am writing it from Israel.

The Journey started by driving in the middle of the night to LAX, followed with an uneventful flight to NY. Uppon arriving to JFK Airport we were informed by other passengers that our flight to Israel is delayed from 9PM to 1AM. As we were standing in line, other passengers were forming more lines next to us trying to inquire in Hebrew, English, and Yiddish what is happening. The desk was overwhelmed, people were tired and cranky, some kids were crying, but Healey and Ofree were doing well. As I was waiting in line 1AM on the flight board was turning to 3AM and a few minutes after to 6AM. Off we went with other passangers to a hotel that was reserved by the airline. NY was freezing and upon arriving to the hotel at 11PM Healey enjoyed touching the snow. A few minutes after and the four of us are sleeping together on a king size bed. At 3AM in the morning we are callws the airline, and 6AM is turning to 10AM.

In the morning the transportation that was supposed to take us to the airport is late, when it finaly comes, other passengers are helping us on the curb, making sure that we won't be late.

After a long flight we finally arrived in Israel 13 hours late, but who is counting. A few hours later one of the biggest storms in Israel's history started: Near the shore, where we are, there is heavy rain and hail. In other places there is heavy snow.

Israel for quite some time is not

were I live, but it is home. Our family, friends and neighbors all want to see us and feed us. The food is great, (tastes, smell, and richness of it) I have missed it so much. I didn't miss the stressful driving, constant news on TV and radio, and so much more; it is overwhelming. Yes, everyone wants a taste of us, and they all want to feed us - A LOT.

We have arrived just in time to my niece's Bat Mitzvah at a fancy restaurant (no Torah reading for girls in Israel, only lots of family and more food). Instead of a Rabbi teaching her, a choreograph with dance moves and singing. She is very cute. A few days after Revital's niece is joining the army, and as we drive to the IDF base to say goodbye Healey is asking if she was drafted to pre school. As Jordan climbs into the bus to start her IDF basic training, all the adults are tearing. This is Israel's right of passage, we all did it, this is our true Bar and Mat Mitsvah, we defend Israel. Israel defends us. We give 3 years (men) and two years (women), and most of us don't expect anything back, just peace - SHALOM.

One more week ahead of us in Israel, time flies (faster then the airlines), and we wonder from one family to another—I told you they all want to feed us.

As we go from meal to meal, I am busy with Hebrew homework. Why Hebrew homework? Because when we come back to the States I am starting to teach Hebrew at UCSB in addition to my duties at Torah School. So I am excited and nervous at the same time

During my first semester at UCSB I will be arriving late to Ner Ami be-

cause of conflicting schedules. I hope that you will understand that this is only temporary. I do apologize for any inconveniences as I am pursuing a long time dream of mine - to teach at a university.

As we are starting our second semester together, with me being Torah School principal, I wanted to say again how honored I am to know all of you, students, parents and teachers. We have an amazing school, we care about our community, and we are striving to be more connected, more involved, and do more. Sharon Spielman Devortzky wrote me this a few days ago:

"VeHadarta Pnei Zaken. (Vayikra 19-something) I want to work with you to organize and coordinate Torah School Families to pick up a senior and drive them to (and from) Shabbat service. We have several seniors that could use the ride and it's always nicer when the kids and seniors minale."

I think that this is a wonderful idea, and with your support, I want to make it happen. We will work together to make this happen.

As I finish this Megilah article, I want to thank all of you, parents, teachers, students, Julia, Rabbi, and Mark, sisterhood, and temple members for your support and kindness in making my transition to the principal position easier. I apologize for my mistakes, and I can't wait for our winter semester together.


January Book: The Paris Wife

Amazon Best Books of the Month

Most of us know or think we know who Ernest Hemingway was -- a brilliant writer full of macho swagger, driven to take on huge feats of bravery and a pitcher or two of martinis -- before lunch. But beneath this man or myth, or some combination of the two, is another Hemingway, one we've never seen before. Hadley Richardson, Hemingway's first wife, is the perfect person to reveal him to us -- and also to immerse us in the incredibly exciting and volatile world of Jazz-age Paris.

The idea to write in Hadley's voice came to me as I was reading Hemingway's memoir, A Moveable Feast, about his early years in Paris. In the final pages, he writes of Hadley, "I wished I had died before I ever loved anyone but her." That line, and his portrayal of their marriage -- so tender and poignant and steeped in regret -- inspired me to search out biographies of Hadley, and then to research their brief and intense courtship and letters -they wrote hundreds and hundreds of pages of delicious pages to another!

I couldn't help but fall in love with Hadley, and through her eyes, with the young Ernest Hemingway. He was just twenty when they met, handsome and magnetic, passionate and sensitive and full of dreams. I was surprised at how much I liked and admired him -- and before I knew it, I was entirely swept away by their gripping love story. I hope you will be as captivated by



this remarkable couple as I am -- and by the fascinating world of Paris in the 20's. the fast-living, ardent and tremendously driven Lost Generation.
